




MEDICAL CAMP @HIS /HER PLACE

"The camp offered free health checks, including BP, blood sugar, and hemoglobin tests, along with general health screening."





It effectively summarized new variants, symptoms, government advice, and everyday precautions. The information was current, practical, and focused on empowering the public with facts and tools to manage COVID-19 as it transitions from pandemic to endemic.

A total of 44 participants attended the session, which was engaging and informative. The program provided a platform for participants to ask questions and seek clarification on various aspects of COVID - 19.

FREE MEDICAL CAMP @SAP SCHOOL

A medical camp was Organized at SAP School, Adi Dravidar Tribal Welfare School, Thirumangalam, under Sundaram Medical Foundation's Adopt a School initiative (Sundaram Arogyam Plan). A multidisciplinary team-Dr. Priyadarshini (Pediatrician), Dr. Aparna (ENT), Dr. Meenakshi (Dentist), Mr. Gunaseelan (Optometrist), along with nurses and social workers- provided comprehensive care.

- The pediatrician provided comprehensive checkups and treatment, while the ENT specialist offered expert care and guidance.
